## Exploring Participatory Approaches in Ageing Studies Agenet Workshop - September 11-12 2025, Bratislava



It is argued that "social inquiry and its methods are productive: they (help to) make social realities and social worlds" (Law and Urry 2011, 390). If this is so, what realities and worlds of ageing transpire when participation is fundamental to the research process? Why is it crucial to use participatory approaches in qualitative and ethnographic research with older adults? What different means of participation exist, and what is their distinctive analytical, dialogical, and expressive potential? How can we design participatory projects without discriminating against individuals with severe health conditions and/or from lower socio-economic backgrounds? And how do participatory approaches become critical, ethico-political practices that foster social change for both present and future generations of ageing people?


EASA Agenet is pleased to invite you to a small-group, interactive workshop on participatory approaches in ageing studies in Bratislava on September 11–12, 2025.

- 2) A concise motivation statement, which may include whatever you expect to learn from the workshop.

## Participation is free of charge.

If the number of applications exceeds the available spots, participants will be selected based on the following criteria:

• The relevance of their current or desired research/professional activities to the workshop theme,

- Disciplinary and institutional diversity,
- Career stage, with priority given to early-career researchers and students.
